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

Bio

Bernadine Fox is an award-winning mental health advocate and a visual artist ([portfolio](#)), writer, social activist, and public speaker in Vancouver BC who constructs narratives that explore various social issues in need of voice. A graduate of ECIAD, for the last 3 years Bernadine has produced and hosted an on-air [radio program, Re-Threading Madness](#) (formerly Both Sides Now) which dares to change how we think about mental health. Bernadine Fox endured sexual and physical abuse as a child, and later at the hands of her therapist and abuser. Despite the lifelong trauma, PTSD, Chronic Fatigue and Osteoarthritis, she selflessly chooses to share her story and use her voice to shed light on the issues of mental health and abuse of power. A mental health advocate for 30+years, she now volunteers for [TELL](#), an organization that provides resources and support for those exploited by their therapists or doctors. Fox takes complex issues and untangles them leaving them easily accessible. Her approach is one of respect for the audience members and the material.
